Hi Ron,

I e-mailed you earlier today that I thought the policy API is hiding behind is unconstitutional. A Washington DC attorney, Marjorie Salwin, gave Psychrights some pro bono time and did some research and it is indeed unconstitutional.

She also pointed out it is only a policy. It isn't even a regulation and has no force of law in this arena.

I am inclined to come by and not only hand out the flyers tomorrow morning, but post them as well. Have your attorneys (who are copied on

this) do some legal research.

Last summer the Alaska Supreme Court ruled API's forced drugging regime

unconstitutional. People are still being forcibly drugged without their rights being honored. I know the hospital does not believe the courts should be able to tell the hospital this, but that is the law.

Your (so far successful) efforts to deny API's inmates the right to choose their own attorney to help them fight being locked up and forcibly drugged has involved the violation of two fundamental constitutional rights. The right to counsel and free speech. The scope of your constitutional violations are breathtaking.
