PsychRights is Seeking to Represent Someone in a Forced Drugging Case

The mission of the Law Project for Psychiatric Rights (PsychRights) is to mount a strategic litigation campaign against unwarranted court ordered psychiatric drugging. The successful *Myers* case decided by the Alaska Supreme Court last summer was part of that effort.

In furtherance of its mission, PsychRights is currently seeking to represent a respondent in an AS 47.30.839 Court-Ordered Administration of Medication proceeding. <u>There will be no cost to our client for this</u>.

Patients at API have the right to choose any attorney who is willing to represent them. API has been notified of PsychRights' desire to represent someone who doesn't want to take the drugs, but has refused to notify the people it is seeking to forcibly drug of this potential opportunity.
