**DEFENDANT JENNIFER KING VASSEL'S BRIEF IN SUPPORT OF
ENTRY OF AN HIPAA QUALIFIED PROTECTIVE ORDER**

Defendant Jennifer King Vassel (Dr. King), by her attorneys, Gutglass, Erickson, Bonville & Larson, S.C., respectfully moves for entry of a HIPAA qualified protective order for medical records from health care providers other than Dr. King that treated N.B. during the time period alleged in the complaint, 2004 to 2008. Dr. King requests an order similar to the order entered in response to the plaintiff's request for a HIPAA qualified protective order. *See* (Documents 116 and 117).

In particular, the records of the following health care providers are requested: the Mendota Mental Health Institute; Rogers Memorial Hospital - Brown Deer; various physicians at the Cedar Mills Medical Group; The Wholistic Health Center; Basil Jackson, M.D.; Bruce Semon, M.D.; Lauren Youngs, M.D.; Inshirah Farhoud, APNP; Mark Simms, M.D.; and Todd Eldon, Ph.D. Moreover, the prescription medication records of Wal-Mart Pharmacy -Saukville, Managed Health Services, Wisconsin ForwardHealth, and BioScrip PBM Services, LLC are also requested.

ARGUMENT¹

Dr. King is requesting these records in order to ascertain all of the health care providers that provided care and treatment to N.B., or provided prescription medication services to N.B., during the time period alleged in the complaint, from 2004 to 2008. These records are relevant in determining whether N.B. received prescription medications from any health care provider other than Dr. King, what prescription medications were prescribed, and how payment was made for those prescriptions. Fed. R. Evid. 401; Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(b)(1). These records may help establish that health care providers other than Dr. King also prescribed the medications alleged in the complaint and support her contention that off-label use of prescription medications can be reimbursed by a state Medicaid program. “In either situation [whether Wisconsin can reimburse for non-FDCA (Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act), non-compensated prescription medications], such information would be relevant to determining whether King Vassel had the required level of knowledge to be found liable for having submitted a false claim.” (Document 116, p. 5).

The limited discovery that has occurred in this case to date establishes that N.B. saw health care providers other than Dr. King during the time period alleged in the complaint. The plaintiff, in his initial disclosures, provided some medical records and some of the claims history report for N.B. *Affidavit of Bradley S. Foley, Exhibit B, Relator’s Initial Disclosures, p. 2 (excluding attachments)*². The ForwardHealth claims history report has Carol Estill, M.D. handwritten on the first page of the

report. *Id.* Dr. Estill is a physician that practiced at Cedar Mills Medical Group, as did Dr. Hagen and Dr. Montgomery, as evidenced in the Encompass-Effective Mental Health Services, Inc. medical records. These records are not enclosed but can be provided under seal. *See* footnote number two.

The Encompass medical records reference numerous health care providers and prescription medication services that have not been previously disclosed. They are listed below:

- Wal-Mart Pharmacy
- Managed Health Services
- BioScrip PBM Services, LLC
- Wholistic Health Counseling Services
- Rogers Memorial Hospital-Brown Deer
- Mendota Mental Health Institute
- Todd Eiden, Ph.D.

The remaining health care providers listed on the first page of this brief, and not listed directly above, were obtained from the initial disclosures of Encompass. *Affidavit of Bradley S. Foley, Exhibit C, Encompass Effective Mental Health Services, Inc.'s Initial Disclosures, pp. 2-4.* As Encompass alleges, its initial disclosures named witnesses that may have had knowledge of facts alleged in the complaint, or the defendant's response. *Id.*, p. 1. Thus Dr. King only is aware that Basil Jackson, M.D., Bruce Semon, M.D., Lauren Youngs, M.D., Inshirah Farhoud, APNP, and Mark Simms, M.D. provided care and treatment to N.B. based on Encompass's initial disclosures. *Encompass's Initial Disclosures, pp. 3-4.*

Dr. King has tried to obtain medical records of N.B.'s health care providers other than Dr. King, but the plaintiff has refused to answer. In response to Dr. King's first set of interrogatories, number nine, the plaintiff declined to name any health care providers who treated N.B. for any physical or mental health condition in the last 10 years. *Affidavit of Bradley S. Foley, Exhibit D, Plaintiff's Responses to Dr. King's First Set of Interrogatories, Number Nine.* The plaintiff stated

that N.B.'s treatment history is "unrelated and completely irrelevant to the issues in this litigation [. . .]" *Id.*

Further, the plaintiff testified that he will not permit discovery of any other health care providers that may have provided care and treatment for N.B., during the time period alleged in the complaint.

Q: Between 2004 and 2008 do you know if there were any gaps in time when he [N.B.] was being treated by someone other than Dr. King for mental health issues?

[. . .]

A: I don't think I can tell you. **But I can tell you that I do know that he was seen by other mental health professionals during that time period.**

Q: What is it that you're referring to to refresh your recollection here in this deposition?

A: I saw a mental health note from another agency during the time period that you asked that would indicate that he was, in fact, seen or treated.

Q: But you won't identify that nor disclose the document to me?

A: Yeah.

Affidavit of Bradley S. Foley, Exhibit E, Deposition of the Plaintiff, pp. 54-55 (emphasis added).

The plaintiff also refused to provide the names of health care providers besides Dr. King that treated N.B. in response to her request for production of documents, number eight. *Id.*, p. 62; *Affidavit of Bradley S. Foley, Exhibit D, Plaintiff's Response to Dr. King's First Request for Production of Documents, Number Eight.* The plaintiff stated that he did not think "I have the right to release it [the identity of healthcare providers] without her [N.B. mother's] permission saying, hey, you can disclose this information. So, yeah, it's kind of HIPPA, I think, protected." *Deposition of the Plaintiff, p. 62.*

The plaintiff admits that N.B. was treated by other health care providers besides Dr. King during the time period alleged in the complaint, yet he refuses to permit an authorization to be signed

to allow access to records of treatment of N.B. “The Supreme Court has interpreted relevance broadly to include any matter that bears on, or that reasonably could lead to other matters that could bear on, any issue that is or may be in the case.” *U.S. ex rel. Camillo v. Ancilla Systems, Inc.*, 233 F.R.D. 520, 522 (S. D. Ill. 2005) (citing *Oppenheimer Fund, Inc. v. Sanders*, 437 U.S. 340, 351 (1978)). Accordingly, this motion should be granted.

CONCLUSION

Based on the foregoing arguments, defendant Jennifer King Vassel respectfully requests that the Court grant her motion and permit her to obtain N.B.’s records from Mendota Mental Health Institute; Rogers Memorial Hospital - Brown Deer; the Cedar Mills Medical Group; The Wholistic Health Center; Basil Jackson, M.D.; Bruce Semon, M.D.; Lauren Youngs, M.D.; Inshirah Farhoud, APNP; Mark Simms, M.D.; Todd Eldon, Ph.D.; Wal-Mart Pharmacy -Saukville; Managed Health Services; Wisconsin ForwardHealth; and BioScrip PBM Services, LLC.

This motion is made within the context of a HIPPA protective order, as the Court permitted in response to the plaintiff’s second motion for a HIPPA qualified protective order. (Document 117). “HIPPA permits protected health information to be revealed in response to a discovery request, if the parties agree to a protective order and have presented it to the Court, or have asked the Court for a protective order.” *Camillo*, 233 F.R.D. at 522 (citing 45 C.F.R. § 164.512(e)(1)).

Relator Dr. Toby Tyler Watson submits the following objections and responses to Defendant Jennifer King Vassel and CAPS Child & Adolescent Psychological Services' First Set of Interrogatories and Request for Production of Documents:

General Objections

The following General Objections apply to every paragraph if the Interrogatories:

1. Relator objects to every interrogatory that calls for privileged information including, without limitation, information protected by the attorney-client privilege.
