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2 THE COURT: We're on record in Case Number
3 3AN-08-247, the Matter of William Bigley. Let's see. I
4 have a sticky note here.
5 In the courtroom for the AG is Mr. Twomey.
6 The public defender, Kelly Gibson. Court visitor --
7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Can you speak up? I
8 can't hear you.
9 THE COURT: I'm sorry. In the courtroom
10 there are Twomey for the AG; Kelly Gibson, the public
11 defender; the court visitor, Ms. Vassar; and Mr. Bigley.
12 Who else do we have in the courtroom?
13 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Rebecca Carstedder
14 (phonetic), Your Honor, from the PD's office.
15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Stacie Rickett
16 (phonetic), from the PD's office.
17 THE COURT: Thank you.
18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Tim Hartman, API
19 escort.
20 THE COURT: Thank you.
21 MR. BIGLEY: (Indiscernible).
22 THE COURT: Oh, okay. Well, thank you for
23 coming in today, Mr. Bigley.
24 All right. We're here on the petition for
25 involuntary commitment. That's the first issue we'll

1 take up, and then the second issue is the meds petition.
2 Mr. Twomey?
3 MS. GIBSON: Actually, Your Honor, I do have
4 one pretrial issue.
5 THE COURT: Sure.
6 MR. BIGLEY: (Indiscernible).
7 MS. GIBSON: Your Honor, at this time,
8 before we have the hearing, I would like this case to be
9 set over for a representation hearing in front of a
10 superior court judge.
11 THE COURT: Okay.
12 MS. GIBSON: This morning an e-mail was sent
13 to me from Mr. Gottstein, who represents Mr. Bigley in
14 other cases.
15 The problem is in this e-mail Mr. Gottstein
16 was communicating to the state about this case,
17 communicating about comments that Mr. Bigley made about
18 this case when he doesn't represent Mr. Bigley.
19 So I think we have some issues. This has
20 sort of been an ongoing issue. I think Mr. Bigley would
21 like Mr. Gottstein to represent him, and has represented
22 to me that he would follow Mr. Gottstein's directions.
23 THE COURT: Okay.
24 MS. GIBSON: So this is an ongoing issue
25 that I think we need to address for Mr. Bigley's

1 benefit, as well as the state.
2 THE COURT: So are you suggesting that we
3 continue this hearing?
4 MS. GIBSON: Yes. I'm suggesting we
5 continue the hearing until we straighten out the
6 representation issue.
7 THE COURT: Mr. Twomey, do you have a
8 position?
9 MR. TWOMENY: No objection, Your Honor.
10 THE COURT: Okay. Ms. Vassar, do you have
11 any objection to that?
12 MS. VASSAR: No, Your Honor.
13 THE COURT: All right. Why don't I ask
14 Madam Clerk to -- if she can call Judge Rindner, who is
15 assigned to this, and see if we can get some time.
16 MS. GIBSON: Your Honor, I would also ask if
17 -- and I will do this -- but if we can do a notice. I
18 would like Mr. Gottstein to also be present.
19 THE COURT: For the hearing?
20 MS. GIBSON: So if you need me to draft a
21 notice for the purposes of the representation hearing, I
22 can do that.
23 THE COURT: That would be great.
24 MS. GIBSON: Can I bring it over here for
25 you to sign?

1 THE COURT: Yes.
2 (Off record.)
3 (On record.)
4 THE COURT: We're back on record in case
5 number 08-247 Probate. Judge Rindner can take this
6 matter tomorrow at 3:00, and Mr. Bigley does not need to
7 be present to participate in that.
8 MR. BIGLEY: Oh, no. I'll be present. It's
9 open court. It's open court.
10 MS. GIBSON: He likes to come to court, so
11 I'll try to make arrangements for that to happen.
12 MR. BIGLEY: This is -- (indiscernible).
13 THE COURT: 3:00 on the 6th. We have the
14 form for everybody to sign stipulating to the
15 continuance. And is that it?
16 MS. GIBSON: Do you still want me to make a
17 notice about the hearing tomorrow for Mr. Gottstein to
18 be present?
19 MR. BIGLEY: (Indiscernible).
20 MS. GIBSON: I'll talk to you after we go
21 off record so that we can --
22 MR. BIGLEY: Put it on record. It has to be
23 on record, everything.
