

Pursuant Appellate Rule 204(e), the points on which appellant intends to rely in the appeal are:

1. The Order on Petition for Involuntary Commitment for Evaluation, entered without notice to Appellant or opportunity to be heard (*Ex Parte* Order), after he was already in custody, denied Appellant his right to Due Process under the constitutions of the United States and State of Alaska.
2. The Superior Court erred by holding the Motion to Vacate *Ex Parte* Order was moot, and
3. The Superior Court erred by failing to consider the Motion to Vacate *Ex Parte* Order even if it was moot.
